Over 5,400 journals from around the globe are indexed with a controlled vocabulary, about 500,000 articles are added each year, and there are about 40 searches per second done via PubMed. Though largely bibliographic, with abstracts (summary of the article), about 1 in 7 are now available full-text. To limit your search results to citations related to substance use and abuse, the search term:</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Substance-Related Disorders[MH]</p> <p>may be added to your search.</p>

Specific objectives are designed to guide public health promotion and disease prevention. The specific objectives are presented for 42 topic areas, including Substance Abuse (with 21 specific objectives) and Tobacco Use (with 20 specific objectives). NIH contracted with a SALIS member to devise specific pre-formulated PubMed search strategies for each objective in these two topic areas. (The search strategies will be added to the website in the near future.)</p>

These are primarily from the professional literature and include journal articles, books, book chapters, and reports. The database is updated quarterly. Online searches can be conducted in Basic or Advanced format.</p>

It includes both active publications and those that have ceased publication, but may be of archival interest. Use the quick or advanced search, view by focus area, by title A-Z, English or non-English, free online, scholarly and peer-reviewed, or view all. Information is about the journal itself – it is not an index of journal articles. Find the journal's on-line location to view its tables of contents, subscription costs, how to submit an article, and more.

Search the contents of many libraries at once for an item, then locate it in a nearby library. Search for books, CDs, videos, digital content such as audiobooks, some article citations, research materials, documents or photos, items of local or historical significance, some full-text items, and digital versions of items not otherwise available to the public. Statistics: 72,000 - # of libraries worldwide included. 170 - # of countries and territories represented. 232,000,000 - # of bibliographic records. Every 10 seconds - how often a new record is added. Over 470 - # of languages and dialects included. Every second - how often WorldCat is searched.
